LOCATION (Endpoints of Canal): Lake Borgne to the Mississippi at Violet																													
TOPOGRAPHIC MAPS: Chalmette LA 7 1/2'																													
HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE: Four miles further downriver from Chalmette on LA 46 is VIOLET LOCK (1939) on the river side of the levee at the S edge of Violet, behind a yellow and white metal building and opposite the end of the LAKE BORGNE CANAL still visible to the east. Privately built, the lock was closed in 1950 and the levee was continued across the lower end, leaving visible only the upper (river end) steel gates and unusual brick walls. This would make a useful quiet historical park overlooking the river. We hope that if the new lock proposed to bypass the Inner Harbor Lock is at this site, the old gates could be bypassed or put on display at the new lock, since there are not many old lock remains left in Louisiana.
